

Polee

Definition: A Polee is a side bet that can have several different meanings, depending on who's playing:

V1) A Polee might be a one-time-only bet during a round. In this case, set the bet amount prior to the round. The first member of the group who gets an approach shot within the length of the flagstick wins the Polee.

V2) A Polee might also be a continuing bet throughout the round. Any time a member of the group puts an approach shot or "putt cheat" within the length of the flag stick; they win a Polee. A Polee is worth one point. A bonus point, of one, will be given for making that putt. Now if a player has a chip-in or flies one in from the fairway they receive the "Super Star" Polee worth three points. Accumulate the most points you win. This can be played within your group or against the field with a front, a back, and total 18 payout.

V3) And another continuing bet throughout the round: In this version, a Polee is won by anyone who sinks a putt from outside the length of the flagstick. Each Polee is worth one point, and whomever has the most points at the end of the round wins the bet. (Be sure to measure putts close to the flagstick distance before the putt is attempted.) This version also can be called **Reverse Polee**.

V4) Team Polee: in this version your pairing group plays as a team. Any time a member of the group puts an approach shot or "putt cheat" within the length of the flag stick; they win a Polee point for their team. Make that putt for a **bonus point** of one. The team that accumulates the most points over 18 holes wins. (8 pts available on each hole)
